This does not need to be limited to tailoring to the unique patient, but also to the unique human being the therapist is, as well as to moment-by-moment change processes. For example, sexual orientation and gender have been identified as important patient characteristics having received too little research attention, so far. Also, advanced methods of capturing the complex interactions between participants' characteristics, therapeutic interventions, and process characteristics can be worth exploring.

- Each participant may submit only one contribution as a first author in the following formats: brief paper, paper in panel, or discussant in a structured discussion.
- Each participant can submit only one poster as a first author.
- Each participant is asked to limit the total number of submissions to no more than five, including roles as presenter, moderator, discussant, or poster presenter.
